2nd Regiment, Missouri Infantry, Co. A (1861)

With Ceremonies for Memorial Day, SUVCW Encampments, and General Ulysses S. Grant Memorial Day, it has been a busy period for our unit. On Memorial, we have traditionally held ceremonies at Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery, the 2nd largest veterans' cemetery in the nation. Unfortunately, the VA leadership and in particular the directors at Jefferson Barracks have not been cooperative when we hold events, so Grant Camp 68 decided to not hold an event there this year. Members of our unit instead attended other ceremonies with the majority of our members supporting ceremonies held by the Francis Wilhelmi Camp 17 and Turner Brigade Reenactor group at St. James Veteran's Home. The home was begun in the 1890s by the Missouri Woman's Relief Corps and was later taken over by the state. A GAR post was also at the home which still has several original buildings and a veterans' cemetery.

On July 27, US Grant Camp and the 2nd Mo Inf Co. A held ceremonies at Ulysses S. Grant National Historic Site, commonly known as White Haven, was commemorating the anniversary of the President/General's passing. This is a ceremony we regularly hold and in the past several years we have been holding it and also supporting, the day before, the U.S. Grant Symposium held at the Soldier's Memorial in downtown St. Louis.
