I'm writing to cordially invite your unit to the 2024 Sons of Veterans Reserve "School of the Piece" on May 11th, at Boscobel, Wisconsin. Please forward this email to members of your SVR unit.

The National Civil War Artillery Association has again generously agreed to provide instructors for our event. Training is open to all interested men or women, regardless of Flag or historical period. Younger members may participate in the training; however, they may not qualify in certain positions. The training is conducted with a full scale Civil War gun, but can be modified for the Mountain Howitzer and smaller guns for earlier periods. The same safety standards apply to all artillery pieces. Various problem scenarios will be covered with training to correct or solve them. The safety qualification, which each student receives upon successful completion of the course, is valid for two years.

Period camping is available on site. A list of off-site accommodations is also enclosed. When completing your registration, please indicate how many of your personnel will be camping on-site. Meals will be the responsibility of the participants. Saturday breakfast and lunch will be provided at a nominal fee. If not cooking on-site, your unit may wish to patronize one of several reputable eating establishments in town.

Uniform wear is recommended as a means for maintaining discipline and unit integrity.

There will be no firing/target practice this year, due to the cost of insurance. Powder/blanks may be fires at times designated by the event coordinator. Bringing powder/blanks are at the unit commander's discretion and are the financial responsibility of the unit. No bounties or reimbursement for powder will be issued. There is no curriculum or qualification requirement that cannons be fired during the training.

Registration fee is \$20 per person, payable to "HQ 4th Military District SVR." Fees and registration need to be sent by Unit Commander before April 27th to me at: 5025 N. 105th Street, Milwaukee, WI 53225-3900



The 47th Missouri Infantry, Company E has been extremely busy these past few months. First, I was immensely honored to be asked to come out of retirement and elected to assume command of this SVR Unit (which I had the honor of starting back in 2008). Our unit activities became quite numerous, but I will share only a few that we have participated in these past three months. October found us busy in Caledonia, Missouri at a historic/heritage festival called Caledonia Pumpkin Fest where we set up a small Civil War camp, and provided historic demonstrations and answered the public's questions about the boys in blue. Our camp was a stone's throw from the original route that Union troops took when they evacuated Fort Davidson in September 1864 and headed towards Rolla, Missouri. Next, we were asked to set up an encampment, provide history demonstrations, and do some Civil War living history at the historic Gov. Thomas C. Fletcher House in Hillsboro, MO. This was a treat because it was Thomas C. Fletcher who raised the original 47th Missouri Infantry during the Civil War. This event is referred to as the annual "Ghost Walk" but is completely historical in its programming. Following this, we marched in two different Veterans Day parades – one in Farmington, MO and the other in DeSoto, MO. We always allow our sisters in the Louisa Volker Auxiliary #215 - ASUVCW to join us whenever possible. After this, we had a true honor which was that our unit was recognized for its numerous efforts over the years in the SVR with a National SVR Unit Citation (certificate & badges). I was truly honored to have the privilege to present these to the men under my command, on behalf of Lt. Col. Brown, during our annual Camp/SVR/Auxiliary Christmas banquet. Our members were extremely surprised at this special award. Following this, our unit always likes to give back and help our communities in any way that we can, and so we once again rang bells at our local Wal-Mart to raise money for the DeSoto Food Pantry. To end our year's activities, we marched in our uniforms in the DeSoto Christmas Parade to the cheers of happy onlookers. As we take a short break to recuperate from our busy last three months, we also anxiously await a new year and the start of activities in March 2024.
