





Monday March 4, 1861 was the day that Lincoln Abraham was first inaugurated as the 16th President. The Nebraska Rangers SVR post guard duty annually at the Lincoln statue on February 12th which is Lincoln's birthday.

It was dedicated to the GAR (Grand Army of the Republic) members that made Wisner their home following the Civil War. Over 100 Civil War veterans made Wisner their home with 46 buried in the Wisner Cemeteries.



Above: The Department of Nebraska and Dakotas held their twelfth Last Soldier Ceremony Saturday May 22 in Dixon's St. Anne's Cemetery. The dedication was hosted by Harrison Camp 53-2 of Wisner. The ceremony honored Pvt.Jeremiah Sullivan, Dixon Counties Last Union Soldier of the Civil War. The Sons have a goal of hosting twenty additional Last Soldier Ceremonies this year. Last year the Son's visited the Northeast counties of Cedar, Madison, Stanton, Cuming, Thurston and Dakota. This year the counties of Pierce, Knox, Antelope, Brown, Cherry, Burt and Dodge counties are on their agenda. The Sons have walked about 700 cemeteries and located over 19,400 Civil War veteran graves in Nebraska. This date has allowed them to identify the last soldier from each of Nebraska's ninety three counties.

The rifle squad is composed of three VFW members from Laurel, Jim Dundan of Pilger, Norm Weber, Rick Marx, Mark Glaubius and Nate Raabe. Nate's two Cub Scout sons (Paxton and ?) assisted with the ceremony.
